Please rinse!</u></p>	 <p>Cartons used for pizzas, breakfast cereals, cat/dog food Shoe boxes</p>  <p>Egg cartons</p>  <p>Juice and milk cartons Cartons used for puddings, sauces and squash</p>  <p>Cartons used for detergents, fabric softener and washing powder, etc.</p> <p><u>NB! Please rinse the cartons!</u></p>	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Newspapers Magazines Advertisements Brochures Writing paper <p>«Corrugated paper bags»: These should be filled with cardboard boxes/corrugated cardboard, wrapping paper, Christmas wrapping paper, books and telephone catalogues.</p> <p>CORRUGATED PAPER BAGS SHOULD BE PLACED NEXT TO YOUR RUBBISH BIN!</p>
